LICENSING OF ANDREW DOARKS AS PRIEST IN CHARGE

The Licensing of Reverend Andrew Doarks as the new priest in charge
of St Michael and All Angels took place on Thursday 14th of June 2018, at 7:30
by the Bishop of Swindon and the Archdeacon of Bristol.

Thank you to everyone who came, and to those who helped as well. It was a
lovely celebratory evening attended by many.

For those who were unable to attend the service which started at 7:30 and
continued late into the evening, contained the licensing and installation of Andrew
Doarks as Priest in Charge, a 29 minute long sermon from the Bishop of Swindon
which focused on community spirit, walking and being living stones. We were
also asked to think about what St Michael's means to us and within the
community. Andrew was also presented with several important items such as a
bible, bread, and wine by members of our congregation before ringing the church
bell four times as a recognition to his new position in the church. These took place
in between several hymns such as King of Kings, Majesty. Andrew was also
welcomed by several members of the wider community and parish. Andrew's first
act as our new priest in charge was to read the upcoming notices which included
inviting everyone to the 10 o'clock Sunday morning service. This was then
followed by a range of canopies prepared by the congregation in the back room of
the church.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

AFTERNOON TEA: *THE VICTORIA SANDWICH*,
with extra special thanks to Mary Prichard for her help

Ingredients

3 Large eggs

Butter or margarine, softened at room temperature

Caster sugar

Self raising flour (additionally half a teaspoon of baking powder depending on the quality of the self raising flour)

Milk, to loosen mixture

Method

Preheat the oven to Gas mark 6

Lightly grease a large baking sheet,. Tip if you fold baking parchment before cutting to size you can prepare more than one at a time.

To start weigh all eggs and measure all other ingredients to the same weight e.g 8 oz of each ingredient except the milk

Grease and line cake tins with baking paper.

Whisk butter and sugar together in a bowl until pale and fluffy and aerated.

Whisk eggs into butter and sugar mix slowly. Tip if you crack each egg separately into another bowl before adding to the mix then you can limit getting any accidental shell into the cake mixture.

Once all the egg has been added continue to whisk to evenly distribute it into the mixture.

It can be helpful to tidy as you go as you have now finished with the butter, sugar and eggs. It is also useful to wash your hands again after mixing in the eggs.

Sift flour into another bowl. Once nice and fine slowly add this into the whisked mixture. Tip mix his together with a spoon in a folding motion in order to keep in the air from previously whisking the mixture. Tip when all mixed together this should be a yellow colour with all the flour incorporated evenly.

Now add a dash of milk to loosen the mix slightly. Tip this is approximately 1 tablespoon's worth.

Place mix into pre-prepared tins so that tins are approximately half full. Tip this is approximately 4 or 5 heaped spoonfuls. Tip make sure mixture is spread evenly within the tin.

Place tins in oven and cook until golden brown. Tip check this at 25 minutes, this may need more depending on the position in the oven

Once cooked, allow to cool on racks. Tip to create a typical victoria sandwich cake layer 2 or more tiers together with jam in between them
